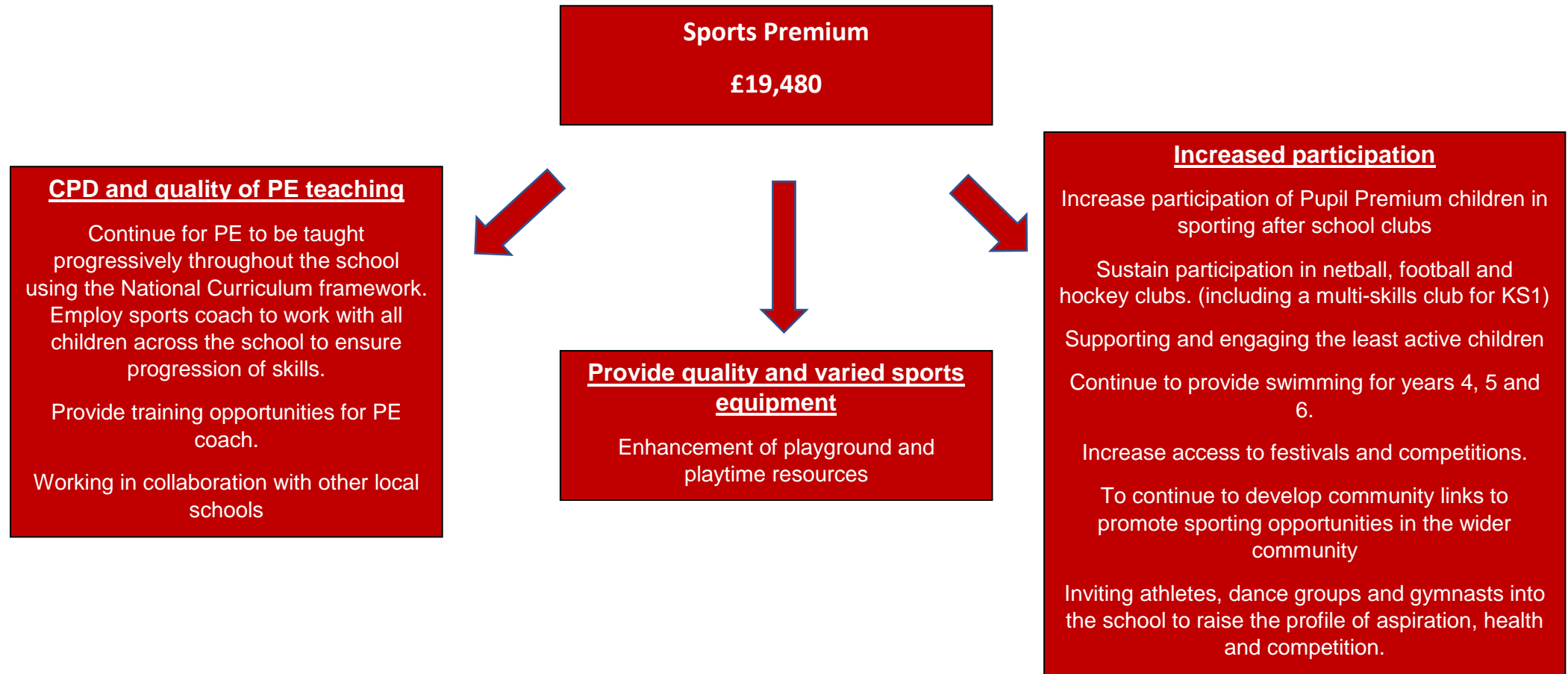


Sports Premium Strategy

‘Valued as Individuals, Inspired and Nurtured as Learners’

At Highbury the intention of the Physical Education curriculum is to equip the children to have the tools to lead a healthy and active lifestyle. To do this Highbury deliver a balanced P.E curriculum that engages children in physical activity. Children will have the opportunity to engage in a variety of sports throughout their time at Highbury. Children from all backgrounds including disadvantaged should have the same opportunities using our school values to promote positive attitudes to learning and developing a growth mind set for all.



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Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety	(18-19)

Year 6 cohort swimming competency (2020/2021)

Two groups were due to participate in swimming lessons at Redwood Park– Target children were to be those in Year 6 (unable to swim 25m unaided) Due to lockdown this has not been achievable. Our 2020-21 cohorts have received no swimming sessions due to lockdowns and we will not be returning now to swimming until Spring 2022 as we review the situation and a phased cautious approach to activities beyond the school.

Due to the restrictions of coronavirus, funding in some areas has not been fully spent. However, this is already £9,337 above the allocated Sports premium grant as the school recognises the significant impact a designated sports/PE coach is having on the quality of PE across the school.
