

What's happening in Year Six?

During this half term we will be exploring the theme 'What happens under the Earth's surface?' The focus of this theme is predominately based around earthquakes and volcanoes.

English

During English lessons we will be initially exploring how to write a biography. Following this, we will then be looking at writing a survival story, centred on volcanoes and earthquakes. We will be finishing our class reader, *The Explorer* by Katherine Rundell, as well as reading nonfiction texts about our theme.

Maths

In Maths we will be covering fractions, decimals and percentages. We will be learning how to add, subtract, divide and multiply fractions, as well as solving word problems involving fractions, decimals and percentages.

The school will continue with homework which will be set each week on a Thursday and will include spellings. Please ensure that this is handed in by Tuesday to allow time for it to be marked.

Encouraging your child to complete their homework each week will ensure they practise skills learnt in class.

Wednesday



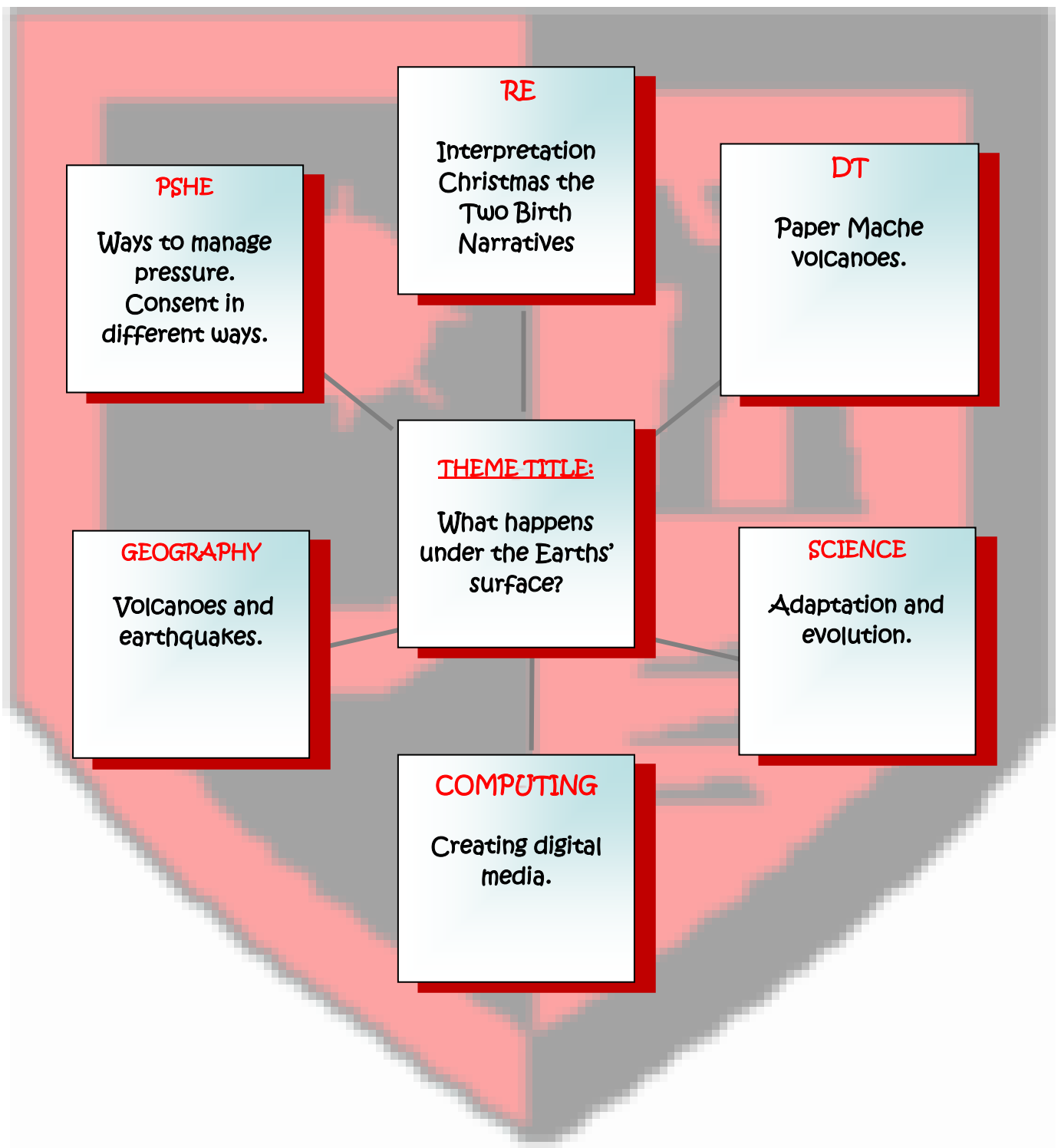
