What's happening in Year Two?

During this half term we will be exploring the theme 'Traditional Tales'

<u>English</u>

During English lessons, we will be looking at traditional fairy tales and those with a twist! We will look at the story 'The True Story of The Three Little Pigs' write our own fairy tales. We will also be learning about non-chronological reports and researching amazing facts to create a fact file all about our class animals.

Design and Technology

In DT we will be researching, designing and making a picnic that meets the needs of a healthy diet. We will be learning about all the food groups as well as practising the skills needed to make a sandwich.

<u>PSHE</u>

This half term, we are introducing 'Zones of Regulation'



which teaches the children about self-regulation - The ability to focus your attention, control your emotions and manage your thinking, behaviour and feelings. We will use the characters from 'Inside Out' to support the children with this.



How have fairy tales changed over time?

<u>Science</u>

As part of our theme work, in science, the children will be exploring animals including humans by looking at the basic needs of animals for survival including the importance of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

<u>Geography</u>

In geography we will be looking at the world around us while exploring human and physical features and comparing them to other places around the country.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we will focus on place value, subitising, using strategies to support our problem solving. We encourage you to help the children use Numbots at home to support their fluency.



Remember, **talk** is a great tool for learning so please encourage your child to talk about what they have done each day.

Phonics

Children will continue with phonics through the scheme of Little Wandle to further support their reading, writing and spelling. Each week, they will be sent home with a book matched specifically to their phonic level. We encourage parents to read daily with their child, and reread familiar books to build fluency.
