#### Learning News, Curriculum Highlights...

This term the children have settled back into nursery and we are so delighted at how well the new children to Highbury have settled in. Our theme has been looking at All About Me! The nursery have been on outings to the park and foxes forest for autumn walks collecting autumn materials and bugs. The children have been looking at a different book each week with themed activities to encourage children listening, attention and recall. The children have enjoyed the outside autumn environment playing with real fruit and vegetables looking at harvest.

This half term it has been wonderful to welcome all of the YR children to Bumblebee and Butterfly class, they have settled in very well. We have enjoyed getting to know the children and they enjoyed sharing about themselves and their families. The children have been busy learning new letter sounds in Phonics, including practicing letter formation and name writing. In Maths we have been mastering the numbers 1-5 and the children have learnt to 'subitise' - recognising amounts straight away, and have also enjoyed building their own number block characters. We learnt about 'people who help us' through imaginative role play and special visits. The children have loved engaging with a new 'book hook' each week, sharing the stories together and using props to help us retell the story. The children have thoroughly embraced 'Autumn'. We've been on Autumnal walks looking for signs of Autumn and collecting natural materials to use for creative crafts. This week the children have got stuck into pumpkin carving, sensory play with pulp/seeds and spooky spider gloop! The children also attended their first assembly with Mrs Watson as part of our Harvest Festival where they sang the Dingle Dangle Scarecrow song. What a fantastic half term with Butterflies and Bumblebees!

This term in **Year 1** we have had lots of fun exploring our theme 'What has changed?'.' The children have enjoyed learning all about changes in our world, including climate change, and they have worked hard to create posters informing people of how they can help protect our world. In Computing, we have been busy learning how to log on to a computer and access different websites. Our Art lessons have involved creating amazing autumnal pictures using the leaves from our very own woods. We have enjoyed getting stuck in to our RE learning all about the Christian celebration of the Harvest Festival and singing our song 'Big Red Combine Harvester'. Year 1 had the most incredible trip to Marwell to help us learn more about our Science topic 'All About Animals' where we were lucky enough to see lots of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. A huge thank you to our amazing parent helpers, the trip wouldn't have been possible without you.

This half term, **Year 2** have enjoyed settling into their new classes. We have worked extremely hard on our writing, producing some amazing fact files about our class animals. We have also been reading traditional tales, but also those with a twist! The children have loved having debates about who the real villain is in lots of classic fairy tales and seeing things from a new perspective. Year 2 have had great fun learning about balanced diets and used their new knowledge to design and make their own sandwiches while focussing on appearance, taste and health. In maths, we have been learning all about place value and are now starting to use what we have learnt to add and subtract two digit numbers. We all are very excited to return after half term so that we can learn all about The Great Fire of London.

This term, **Year 3** have enjoyed delving deep into our Rocks and Fossils topic. We became geologists with mini professors for a rocks and fossils workshop, and through our science lessons have been exploring what rocks and fossils are, their different types, and how they are formed. In English we learnt all about writing a dinosaur fact file and read about lots of different prehistoric species, culminating in the children writing a fact file about their own imagined dinosaur. Also, the children learnt all about the life of famous palaeontologist, Mary Anning, and wrote a biography about all of her achievements. In Art, the children practised their sketching skills and worked towards making a chalk masterpiece of a dinosaur's eye. We have loved reading a Julia Donaldson favourite, the dinosaur's diary, which will give us a great model for our next piece of writing!

Learning News, Curriculum Highlights...

This term, **Year 4** have enjoyed learning about the Tudors, especially the Mary Rose as we were fortunate enough to visit the museum at the Historic Dockyard, which was a great day enjoyed by all. We have immersed ourselves in learning about the Tudors, writing some brilliant diaries and newspaper articles about life throughout the Tudor era. We have also started designing and making Tudor houses, which we will finish after half term. We have become scientists with mini-professors, where we learnt all about sound, how it travels and why the amplitude changes. We have also been learning to play the ukulele in Music, which has allowed us to develop our rhythm and understanding of tempo. The children have also loved their Guided Reading lessons, where they have been reading 'The Accidental Prime Minister', following Joe's journey to spread fun wherever he goes. We are looking forward to learning all about electricity next half term.

WOW! What a fantastically busy half-term we have had in **Year 5**. We have thoroughly enjoyed our Space theme and definitely gone 'above and beyond' in all of our learning. Our futuristic Art pictures have dazzled our teachers and our super science skills, (all about our galaxy) have been as equally impressive. In English, we have created our own amazing story endings for Major Tom, in Space oddity, and showcased all the very best of our writing skills. Our non-chronological report writing has been excellent and we have successfully used all of the features of a fact-file about space, to create some amazing reports. Our Mathematical journey has been as equally busy and we have worked hard at place value, ordering, partitioning, comparing and rounding numbers. We have also demonstrated some fantastic mental strategies and conquered addition and subtraction of numbers with 4-digits or more. Our excellent trip to the Science centre was a super success and our amazing behaviour was commented on by the centre staff. After all of that amazing learning, we are ready for a fabulous and restful half-term break!

**Year 6** have had a fantastic start to the year, they have settled really well and are enjoying the responsibility of being the top of the school. They have enjoyed leaning lots about the Amazon Rainforests through our theme and writing a diary extract about their adventures there. In maths we have been work on place value and additive problem solving. In science we have been learning all about how to classify living things and why fungi are so important to the circle of life. The children have been excellent role models during their swimming lessons at the Mountbatten Centre and have really impressed us with their swimming skills and determination to succeed.

Have a great half -term holiday and we will look forward to more great learning next half term
